This international town dominates Tokyo's night scene.

Roppongi Intersection is the crossing of Tokyo and the world. Starting from here, walk through the crowds on Roppongi Dori, toward Roppongi Hills, the new landmark. You can spend your time in any way you like, from eating good food and shopping to experiencing the arts. After enjoying the urban city, go next to Azabu Juban Shopping Town, and savor the atmosphere of old Tokyo. Among the many stores, taiyaki (carp-shaped cake) shops and soba (noodle) restaurants attract people from all over the country.

B-3 Roppongi Intersection 六本木交差点



The intersection of Roppongi St. and Gaienhighashi St. Café Almond and Seishido Books are land-marks.

B-2 Roppongi Hills 六本木ヒルズ



Roppongi Hills is an extraordinary complex where approximately 224 shops, restaurants, movie theatres, residences, hotels, a broadcaster, an observatory of 250m above sea level and art museums coexist in an 11ha area.
