HAKONE

Hakone (箱根), about 1 hr. 30 min. by rail from Shinjuku and Tokyo stations, is one of the most popular inland tourist resorts in Japan. Wedged between Mt. Fuji and Izu Peninsula, it is a large region encircled by several forested mountains and has a beauty dramatically accented by deep glens and ravines.

In the feudal era, Hakone was a very important checkpoint that safeguarded the security of Edo (now Tokyo) as the seat of the Shogunate. Historical relics and documents on display are well preserved. Several museums are open to the public.

Sightseeing highlights are Lake Ashi, nestled in dense forest, Owakudani (Greater Boiling Valley) with its plumes of sulfurous steam gushing upward, and numerous hot-spring rest spots in attractive natural settings. Hakone's wide variety of travel diversions draws large numbers of holidaymakers year-round.

Miyanoshita Area

Hakone-Yumoto (箱根湯本), 1 hr. 30 min. by Odakyu Railways' limited express from Shinjuku, is a main gateway to the Hakone Spa District. Yumoto Spa, the oldest in the district, sprang up at the confluence of the Sukumo River and the Hayakawa River, the outlet of Lake Ashi. Well-appointed inns are located in quiet settings along the picturesque gorge.

Miyanoshita (宮ノ下), 25 min. by rail from Hakone-Yumoto, is the most thriving spa town in Hakone, with many excellent hotels and inns as well as souvenir shops. This spa is so popular with foreign travelers that many English signboards are seen

around town. It is a starting point for side tours to Lake Ashi, Gora Spa and the Sengokuhara Plain. Delightful walks and drives can be enjoyed through the wooded hills and vales.

Gora Park (強羅公園), a 5-min. walk from Gora Station, is the largest rock park in the Orient. Passing through the rose-draped archway, visitors enjoy a stroll along brick paths. The main attraction is a gigantic fountain pond. The park boasts a natural museum, an alpine plant garden and a tropical botanical garden. Admission is charged.

Owakudani (大涌谷, Greater Boiling Valley), 5-7 min. by ropeway from Sounzan, lies in the ancient crater of Mt. Kamiyama. The entire gorge reeks of sulfurous fumes. Clouds of steam rise from crevasses, hot springs bubble out, and in some cases, hot water has been tapped and piped to distant places.

Lake Ashi (芦ノ湖), 725 m. (2,378 ft.) above sea level, is a principal attraction of Hakone. It has a circumference of 21 km (11 mi.) with an aquatic area of 680 ha. (2.7 sq. mi.). The lake abounds in black bass and trout, which makes angling a main leisure activity, along with boating. It is also well known for the inverted reflection of Mt. Fuji seen on a clear day. Regular pleasure boat service links Togendai or Kojiri on the north and Moto-Hakone or Hakone-Machi on the south, some with a stopover at Hakone-en Park en route.

By Japan Railways

Tokyo (東京) Sta. → Odawara (小田原) Sta., a main gateway to the Hakone district.

- ① By Tokaido Shinkansen "Kodama" (東海道新幹線こだま), takes 35 min., runs every 20 - 30 min., ¥3,440 (reserved seat).
- ② By rapid train "Acty" or local train on the Tokaido Line (東海道線 快速アクティ/普通), takes 1 hr. 5 - 30 min., a train runs every hour, ¥1,450.

By Odakyu Railways

Shinjuku (小田急新宿) Sta. (in Tokyo) → Odawara (小田原) Sta. or Hakone-Yumoto (箱根湯本) Sta.

- ③ By Limited Express "Romance Car" (小田急ロマンスカー), takes 1 hr. 5 - 15 min. (¥1,720 to Odawara), and 1 hr. 25 min. (¥2,020 to Hakone-Yumoto), 1 - 4 trains run every hour until around 20:30 (to Odawara), and up to 2 trains run every hour (to Hakone-Yumoto) until around 19:00. (More trains available on Sat., Sun. & national holidays.) Seat reservation is a must.

- ④ By Express (小田急急行) ¥850 to Odawara, takes 1 hr. 30 min., runs every 6 - 20 min. until around 23:35. From Odawara, take Hakone Tozan Railway (箱根登山鉄道) to Hakone-Yumoto (¥300), which takes 15 min., and runs every 15 - 30 min.

By Odakyu Express Bus (小田急高速バス)

- ⑤ Shinjuku Sta. Nishiguchi Bus Stop (in Shinjuku Bus Terminal) → Gotemba Sta. Bus Stop → Hakone-Togendai Bus Stop (Lake Ashi) via Tomei Express Highway, 20 buses run daily (6:30-19:30 every 30 min.), takes 1 hr. 37 min., ¥1,630 (Shinjuku → Gotemba Sta.); 2 hrs. 10 min., ¥1,950 (Shinjuku → Togendai). Bus leaves from Bus Stop No. 35 in front of Odakyu HALC Department Store, west exit of JR Shinjuku Sta. When you use "Hakone Free Pass" or "Hakone Weekday Pass" (Please see the insert.), a surcharge (e.g. ¥850 from Shinjuku to Hakone-Togendai) is required. Reservation is recommended.

- ⑥ By JR Tokaido Shinkansen “Kodama” (東海道新幹線こだま) to Mishima (三島) Sta., Atami (熱海) Sta. or Odawara Sta., then by bus from Mishima or Atami to Hakone (See Page 2 for access from Odawara to Hakone.):
- ⑦ **Mishima** → Hakonemachi or to Moto-Hakone
Hakone Tozan Bus (箱根登山バス) runs every hour from 7:40 to 17:40, takes 40 min., ¥940 (to Hakonemachi), or 50 min., ¥1,000 (to Moto-Hakone).
- ⑧ **Atami** → Hakonemachi
Izu Hakone Bus (伊豆箱根バス), runs every 20 – 50 min. from 9:15 to 15:35, takes 1 hr., ¥1,120 to Hakone-sekishoato (5-min. walk to Hakonemachi).
- ⑨ **Atami** → Moto-Hakone
Izu Hakone Bus (伊豆箱根バス) runs 11 times a day from Mon. to Sat., takes 1 hr. -1 hr. 5 min., ¥1,150.

Some of the Izu Hakone Buses terminate at Hakone-sekishoato, which is a 5-min. walk from Hakonemachi, runs every 20 – 70 min. 8 Izu Hakone buses run daily until 15:55 from Odawara via Komagatake (Cablecar Sta. for Mt. Komagatake) to Hakone-sekishoato.

Cable Car & Ropeway Service

- ⑫ * Cable car between Gora and Souzan by Hakone Tozan Railway (箱根登山鉄道) runs every 15 – 30 min., until 19:00, takes 9 min., ¥410.
- ⑬ * Ropeway between Souzan and Togendai by Hakone Ropeway (箱根ロープウェイ), runs about every 50 sec., from 9:00 until 17:30 (Mar. – Jul. & Sep. – Oct.), from 9:30 until 16:00 (Dec. – Jan.) or from 8:30 until 17:30 (Aug.), from 9:30 until 16:30 (Feb.) takes 25 min., ¥1,330 (one way), ¥2,340 (round trip).

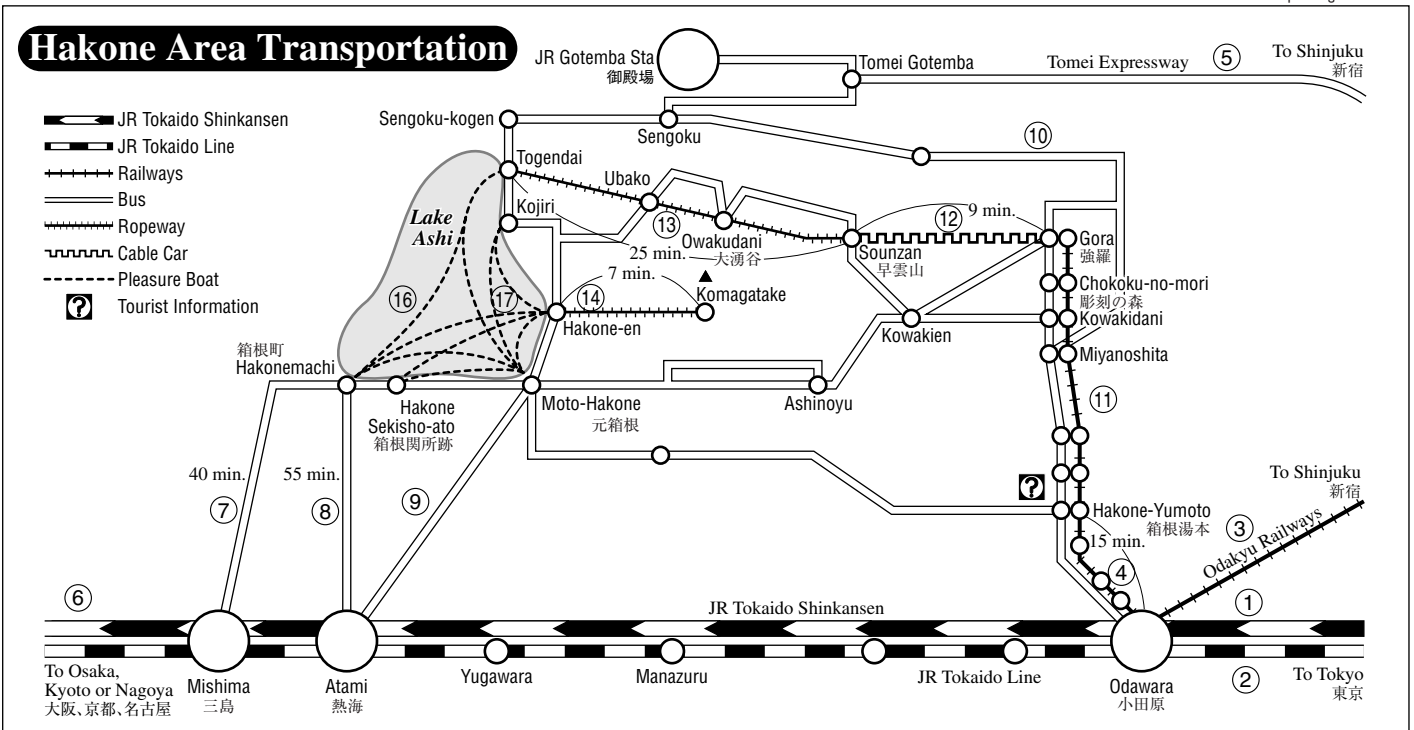

Open: 9:00-17:00 (Mar. -Nov.); 9:00-16:00 (Dec. -Feb.). Admission: ¥1,600 including The Picasso Museum. A collection of late 19th and 20th century sculpture by Western and Japanese artists.

Hakone Art Museum(箱根美術館) 1300, Gora, Hakone-machi, Ashigarashimo-gun, Kanagawa Pref. Tel. (0460)2-2623. 1-min. walk from Koen-kami Cable Car Stop. Cable car leaves from Gora Sta. on Hakone-Tozan Railway. Open: 9:30-16:30 (Apr. -Nov.); 9:30-16:00 (Dec. -Mar.). Closed: Thu. (except

national holidays). Admission: ¥900. A collection of pottery and porcelain from Japan. Bamboo and moss garden in the museum grounds.

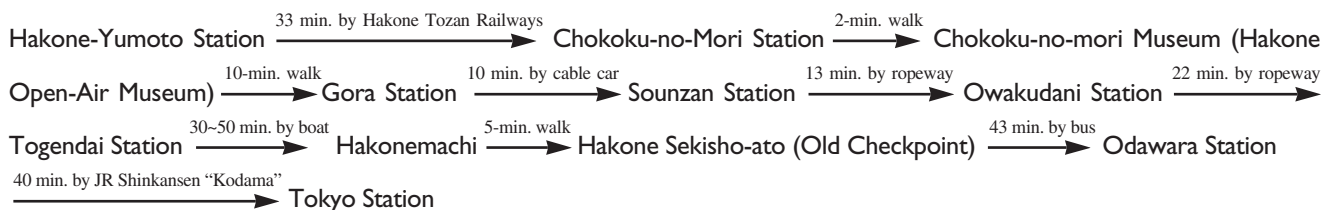
Narukawa Art Museum(成川美術館) 570, Moto-hakone, Hakone-machi, Ashigarashimo-gun, Kanagawa Pref. Tel. (0460)3-6828. 40 min. by bus from Hakone-yumoto Sta. to Moto-hakone Bus Stop. Open: Daily. 9:00-17:00. Admission: ¥1,200. Commanding a panoramic view of Ashi Lake and Mt. Fuji, Narukawa Art Museum is a unique museum showing only modern Japanese-style paintings. More than 100 paintings are displayed.

Excursion Passes

* **Hakone Free Pass** (箱根フリーパス) (Validity: 3 days): This pass offers a return ticket (between Shinjuku Sta. in Tokyo or any other departure station and Odawara Sta. on Odakyu Railways), and a free ride on transportation in the Hakone area, such as Hakone Tozan Train, Hakone Tozan Bus, Numazu Tozan Tokai Bus, Hakone Ropeway, Hakone Sightseeing Ship, Hakone Tozan Cablecar, and Odakyu Hakone Highway Bus between Togendai and Gotemba. Please note that the Limited Express "Romance Car" surcharge (e.g. ¥870 for a trip between Shinjuku and Odawara/Hakone-Yumoto) is not included. This pass also provides you with discounted entrance fees at about 50 tourist facilities in the Hakone area. Cost of the pass: ¥5,500 from Shinjuku (¥2,750 for children), and ¥4,130 from Odawara (¥2,070 for children), the latter of which is especially recommended for Japan Rail Pass holders. Hakone Free Pass and Hakone Weekday Pass are sold at any Odakyu Railways Station, Odakyu Travel Service Co. and other major travel agencies.

* **Hakone Weekday Pass** (箱根ウイークデーパス) (Validity: 2 days):

This pass includes a return ticket (between Shinjuku Sta. or any other departure station and Odawara Sta. on Odakyu Railways), allowing you to take a free ride on the same transportation as with Hakone Free Pass. The day of departure is set for Mon., Tue., Wed. or Thu. except for national holidays and during Mar. 19 – Apr. 10, Apr. 28 – May 5, Jul. 19 – Aug. 31 & Dec. 29 – Jan. 3. ¥4,700 from Shinjuku (¥2,350 for children), ¥3,410 from Odawara (¥1,700 for children), the latter of which is especially recommended for Japan Rail Pass holders. This pass also offers a discounted entrance fee at about 50 tourist facilities in the Hakone area.

* **Fuji Hakone Pass** (富士箱根パス) (Validity: 3 days):

This pass allows you to take only a one-way free ride on *Odakyu Railways* between Shinjuku and Odawara, *Chuo Highway Bus* between Shinjuku Highway Bus Terminal and Kawaguchiko Sta. Please note that the Limited Express “Romance Car” surcharge (e.g. ¥870 for a trip between Shinjuku and Odawara/Hakone-Yumoto) is not included. *Chuo Highway Bus* includes both *Keio Bus* and *Fujikyū Bus*. Advanced reservation is required. This pass also offers free ride on transportation in the Hakone area, such as *Fujikyū Bus*, *Hakone Tozan Train*, *Hakone Tozan Bus*, *Hakone Tozan Cablecar*, *Hakone Ropeway*, *Hakone Sightseeing Ship*, *Odakyu Hakone Highway Bus*. This pass also provides you with discounted entrance fees at about 50 facilities such as museums or temples in Fuji-Hakone area. Guide maps in English, Chinese and Korean are available. Cost of the pass: ¥7,200 (¥3,600 for children).

KAMAKURA

Kamakura (鎌倉), 1 hr. by train from Tokyo, was once the seat of a feudal government established in 1192 as the first of its kind in Japan. It is now noted for its historic sites, seaside bathing beach, and residential district within commuting distance to Tokyo.

Flanked and fortified by wooded mountains on three sides and Sagami Bay on the south, the city has many renowned temples and shrines as well as well-preserved historical treasures surrounded by beautiful hills in a rustic setting. Exploring on your own is the best way to enjoy a tour of Kamakura.

The Great Buddha, the magnificent Tsurugaoka Hachimangu Shrine, Zen temples and picturesque Enoshima Island draw large numbers of visitors to Kamakura throughout the year.

Getting to Kamakura from Tokyo:

From Tokyo Station:

55 min. by JR Yokosuka Line (JR横須賀線) (Underground

Platform—Track 1 or 2). ¥780 to Kita-Kamakura, ¥890 to Kamakura.

From Shinjuku Station:

1 hr. by JR Shonan-Shinjuku Line (Track 1-4); ¥890 to Kita-Kamakura or Kamakura.

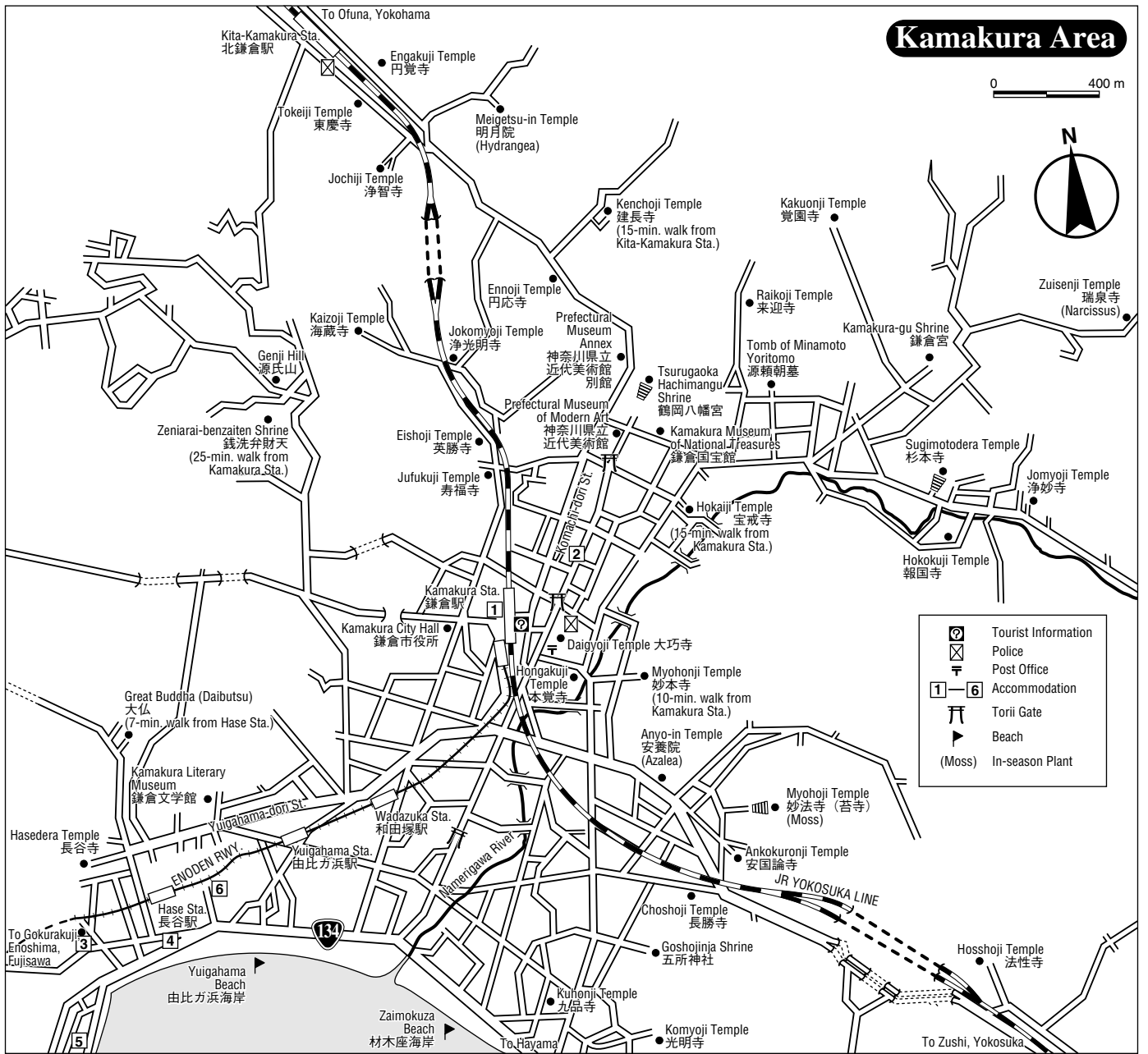
From Shinagawa Station:

45 min. by JR Yokosuka Line (Track 14). ¥690 to Kita-Kamakura or Kamakura.

From Yokohama Station:

27 min. by JR Yokosuka Line (Track 9). ¥290 to Kita-Kamakura, ¥330 to Kamakura.

Access to Enoshima Island from Kamakura:

- By Keikyu Bus from Kamakura Sta. East Exit Bus Terminal, takes 35 min., runs every 30 - 50 min., ¥300 (Refer to the bus chart on the left.). Traffic jam is expected especially weekends and summer time.
- By Enoden Railways (Enoden Kamakura Sta. - Enoshima Sta.), takes 25 min., runs every 12 min. (every 25 min. in the early morning and late night), ¥250.

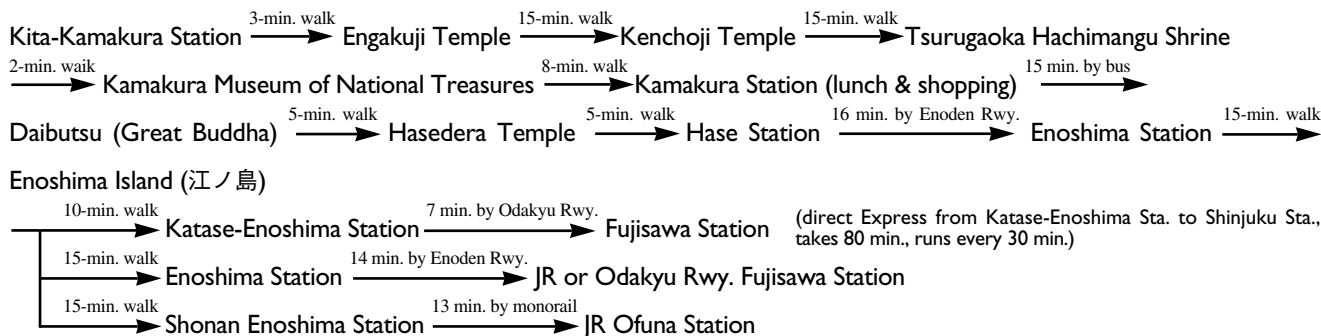
Kamakura Enoshima Free Kippu (鎌倉・江ノ島フリーきっぷ) (Validity: 2 days):

This ticket offers you unlimited transportation in the Kamakura and Enoshima area for *Japan Railways (JR)*, *Enoden Railways* and *Shonan Monorail*, and covers the fare for one round-trip by JR local train between the station where you start from and Ofuna Sta. or Fujisawa Sta. Cost of the pass: ¥1,970 from any station on JR Yamanote Line, or ¥1,130 from Yokohama Sta.

Enoshima Kamakura Free Pass (江ノ島・鎌倉フリーパス) (Validity: 1 day):

This pass covers the basic fare for one round-trip by ordinary train between any station on *Odakyu Line* where you start from and Fujisawa Sta., and offers a free ride on transportation in the Kamakura and Enoshima area as follows:
Enoden Railways (Cost: ¥1,430 from Shinjuku Sta., and ¥600 from Fujisawa Sta.)
