Kamakura/Enoshima Excursion Ticket

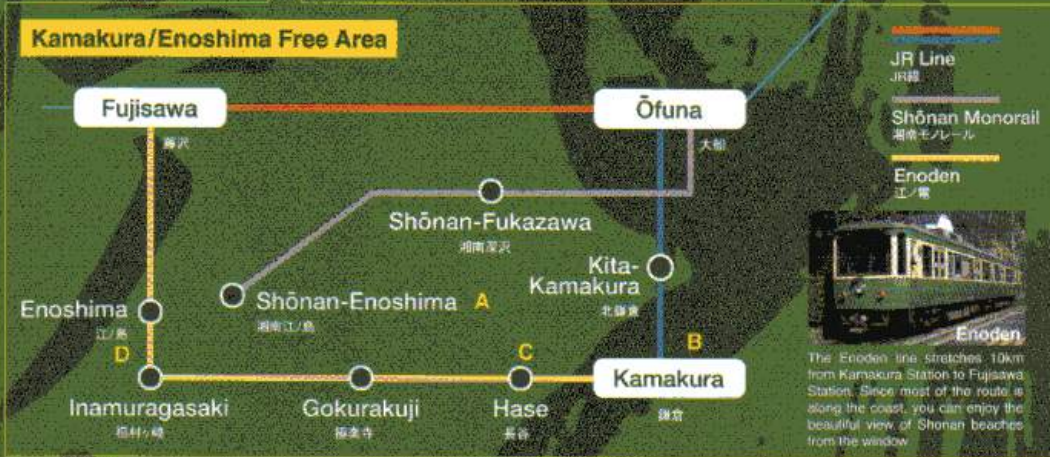

Kamakura is filled with historical landmarks including the Great Buddha, and the Enoshima area has Japan's most popular beaches. This convenient ticket allows you to travel to both locations, giving you a great deal on both nature and history.

The area indicated by is outside of the Free Area.



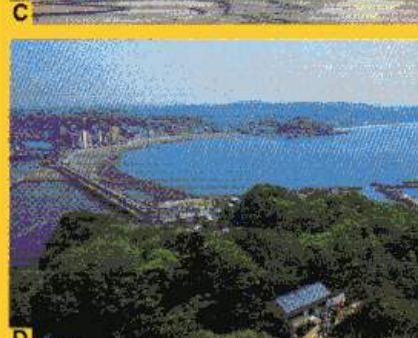
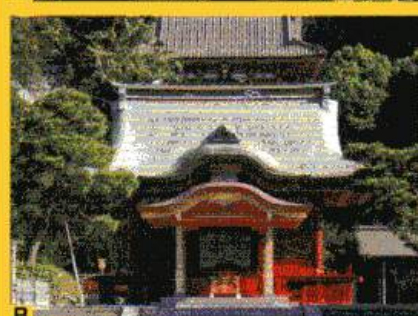
- This ticket offers unlimited travel within the Kamakura/Enoshima Free Area (shown above) for two whole days on JR local and rapid trains' non-reserved seats in ordinary cars, the Enoden line, and on the Shōnan Monorail.
- Non-reserved seats in ordinary cars on local and rapid trains can be used once to get to and from the Free Area.
- This ticket can be purchased at a Ticket Office (Midori-no-madoguchi) or Travel Service Center (View Plaza) at major JR EAST stations within the Tokyo metropolitan area (some exceptions apply). Note that this ticket cannot be purchased within the Free Area.

● **Price: Adult 1,970 yen (from any station on the Yamanote Line) Child 1,000 yen**

● **Valid period: 2 days**

Major Sightseeing Locations in Kamakura

- The Great Buddha of Kamakura**
Kotokuin Temple's principal image of Buddha is also known as one of the greatest Buddha statues in Japan. The hollow interior of the statue is open to the public.
- Tsurugaoka Hachimangu Shrine**
This long-respected shrine was constructed on the orders of Yoritomo Minamoto, the founder of the Kamakura Shogunate, to invite the god of warriors to reside and guard the Genji family. The natural beauty includes the spring cherry blossoms and the summer lotus flowers.
- Hasedera Temple**
The temple is famous for its huge wood carving of Kannon. Its year-round natural beauty as well as views of the ocean and city bring many visitors.
- Enoshima Island & the Shonan area**
A sightseeing spot renowned for its scenic beauty since the Edo-era. Also features an aquarium and many other fun spots.
- Shojin Ryori (Vegetarian Dish)**
A traditional Japanese vegetarian meal containing vegetables and seasonal grains. Its healthy properties have been gaining popularity in modern diets.
